Integrated Pain Care: New Perspectives September 13-15, 2019

This conference will address the complex landscape of acute and chronic pain treatment across the continuum of primary care, specialty care and allied health care, including education on pharmacological, non-pharmacological, interventional and rehabilitation based options.

The curriculum is intended for participants with fundamental as well as advanced knowledge of chronic pain. The focus of the meeting is on clinical topics such as responsible and ethical prescribing for pain patients, interventional pain treatment options and advances, identification of risk factors in the treatment of pain patients, psychopharmacology, use of pain psychology in pain care, and understanding the role of rehabilitation in pain treatment.

Louisiana Controlled Dangerous Substance Education (CDSCME): 3.5 hours of content will provide education in the best practices for prescribing CDS, drug diversion training, appropriate treatment for addiction, and the treatment of chronic pain. This specific content has been approved by the Louisiana Board of Medicine, and will meet the one time, lifetime requirement for CDSCME education in that state.

AUDIENCE

Physicians, nurse practitioners, psychologists and any other interested healthcare professionals.

CONFERENCE OBJECTIVES

At the conclusion of this program, healthcare providers will be able to:

- Identify the current recommendations for the prescribing of controlled substances.
- Discuss how the psychology of pain management, opioid risk assessments and psychiatric diagnoses impact care.
- Practice the Medication-Assisted Treatment (MAT) model, combining the use of medications with counseling and behavioral therapies as an effective treatment for opioid use disorders.
- Describe integrated approaches to neuropathic pain using hormonal and functional restoration modalities.
- Explain current neurostimulation and interventional modalities including a review of spinal cord stimulation, dorsal root ganglion stimulation, and peripheral nerve stimulation.
