The curriculum is intended for participants with fundamental as well as advanced knowledge of chronic pain and will cover a wide variety of talks including VR, Fibromyalgia, Interventional Talks, Pain and Obesity, Patient Interviewing, PT, Disparities in Opioid Use Disorder, Difficult and Violent Patients, Sleep and Pain, the Role of PA's, Medication Management and much more. We will address personalized care for the patient and center on clinical decision making that requires the latest scientific knowledge and techniques.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

1. Review common legal issues and mitigation strategies in pain clinics.
2. Discuss the utilization of Virtual Reality in Pain Management
3. Determine the diagnosis, *mechanistic subtypes* and the 'precision' treatment for Fibromyalgia

5. Review multimodal and polypharmacy best practices for medication management.
6. Define ways to de-escalate violence and other adverse situations in the pain clinic.
